March Walk in Eastwood

We will be visiting Eastwood on March 10 & 11. We will start from the Eastwood Baptist Church at 3212 James St. There is parking behind the church that can be found by turning off James St. on to Homecroft Rd. There also is on street parking on either Homecroft Rd or Mosley Dr. Look for the RED doors with the WELCOME sign. There is either a short flight of stairs up and thru the door or an elevator is on the left when you enter. If using the elevator please make sure the door and gate are close for the elevator to work. Push #2 button to go up, walk through the room to the hall and turn left. Sign up begins Sat. 8-11 a.m. and Sun. 1-3p.m.

Eastwood started out as a village but was annexed to the City of Syracuse in 1926—thus the nickname "The Village within the City." The neighborhood retains a strong sense of community as witnessed by its efforts to maintain the area as a clean, attractive, walkable place. You'll be walking pass some of the 6000 houses in Eastwood most of these homes were built in the 1930s, 40s and 50s. They are located on well-established, tree lined streets. You will also be passing the Eastwood Veterans's Monument across the street from Shotwell/James St. Greenway Park. The Eastwood Assoc. spearheaded a rededication ceremony on Veteran's day 2014, with new flags and new monuments made by Karl Lutz Monuments Co. who has been in Eastwood since 1932(2718 James St.). Other places of interest, The Palace Theatre opened in 1924, the Midler House(2649 James St.) it is presumed to be the oldest residential house in Eastwood.

We encourage you to stop in at one of the many local shops, coffee, Cafe' Kubal for a cup of "The Eastwood", for the reader, Books End or Books & Melodies two of the finest used book stores in CNY, Chase Cigar Store (2701 James St), and for the sweet tooth a new but not typical bakery Crave Dessert Studio (2721 James St.).

There will be no 15 minutes of fame this month.

We are asking that you bring either a can/boxed food item, cereal, Mac n cheese, peanut butter, or paper products i.e. Paper towels, toilet paper, baby diapers or personal items for the neighborhood food pantry that the Eastwood Baptist Church is involved with.

Directions

From points East: Take I-690W to Thompson Rd. exit 16-S-N Rte. 635, GOING NORTH ON THOMPSON RD, (Bristol-Myers will be on your right), go up 4 traffic lights and turn left onto James St. (there will be a WENDYS on your left). On James St. at 2nd traffic light turn left onto Homecroft Rd. Church will be on your left. Use the RED DOORS with Welcome sign.

From points WEST: Take I-690E to Thompson Rd. exit 16- S-N Rte. 635 follow directions above.

From points NORTH: Take I-481 S to I-690 W to Thompson Rd. exit 16-S-N Rte. 635 follow direction above.

From points SOUTH: Take I-81 N to I-690E to Thompson Rd. exit 16-S-N Rte. 635 follow directions above.

Triathlon

About Us

Folksmarches are generally held on the second weekend every month. Registration is held between 8 am and 11 am on Saturdays, and from 1 to 3 pm on Sundays of the event. Participants walk at their own pace, and the purpose is strictly for fun, fellowship and exercise.

The route distances are a choice of either 5K (3.1 miles) or 10K (6.2 miles). Routes vary at each location, but normally include a combination of paved walkways and natural settings. Routes are marked and a map is provided to each walker. A shorter modified route is always available to those who choose not to walk the longer distances.

Participants receive a pin to commemorate the walk and passports are available (for a fee) for participants to record their personal accomplishment after each walk. Purchasing an Annual Pass or a Yearly Passport is a way to become a member of the CNY Folksmarch walking group.
