May Walk in Auburn

The May Folksmarch will be in Auburn, 'History's Hometown.' The dates are Saturday, May 19th and Sunday, May 20th . Registration is at St Alphonsus Church on Genesee Street.

Our walk is on the East side of the city, starting a few blocks from downtown. We begin at St Alphonsus Church on Genesee St and head East to beautiful Hoopes Park. Hoopes Park was created in 1922 on land donated by the Edward Hoopes family. The planting beds follow plans created in 1931. It is popular in the Summer for concerts, movies and art exhibits, and weddings. The large pond is home to waterfowl and there are rumors of a very large snapping turtle!

We continue through the neighborhood, walking West toward the Owasco River. We cross the Owasco River on the Lake Avenue bridge. (Note: the Greenway Trail Project is underway to create a bicycle and pedestrian path along the River. This will extend about 6 miles from Emerson Park in the South to Wadsworth Park to the West of downtown.) After crossing the bridge we take Elizabeth St over to South Street and will be able to view some of the beautiful mansions built in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Then East to cross over the river once again and return to St Alphonsus Church.

Notes: Dogs are welcome this month. They need to be on leashes and we need to clean up after them.

There will not be a 15 minutes of fame this month.

Directions

1)West on 690 and then 695 toward Auburn to where it ends at Route 5. Continue West on Route 5 into the city of Auburn. You will see Auburn Plaza on the right, then Denny's, Taco Bell and Walgreen's on the left. Turn left onto Seward Ave. (There is a traffic light with a left turn signal.) Follow Seward Ave to the traffic light at Genesee Street where you turn right. St Alphonsus Church is four blocks ahead on the right.

Or: 2) Drive West on Seneca Turnpike. Just before the village of Marcellus turn left to continue on Route 175 on the Lee-Mulroy Road.

Follow Route 175 to Route 20 and turn right. Drive through Skaneateles and continue on Route 20 into Auburn.

Parking: We enter the parking lot from Genesee Street to the right of the church. The school building is straight ahead as you enter the parking lot. Please park in the spaces to the left of the school.

Registration is in the school building which is just behind the church. We enter through the doors facing Genesee Street.

About Us

Folksmarches are generally held on the second weekend every month. Registration is held between 8 am and 11 am on Saturdays, and from 1 to 3 pm on Sundays of the event. Participants walk at their own pace, and the purpose is strictly for fun, fellowship and exercise.

The route distances are a choice of either 5K (3.1 miles) or 10K (6.2 miles). Routes vary at each location, but normally include a combination of paved walkways and natural settings. Routes are marked and a map is provided to each walker. A shorter modified route is always available to those who choose not to walk the longer distances.

Participants receive a pin to commemorate the walk and passports are available (for a fee) for participants to record their personal accomplishment after each walk. Purchasing an Annual Pass or a Yearly Passport is a way to become a member of the CNY Folksmarch walking group.
