January Folksmarch: Destiny USA

Destiny USA is our host for the January FM again this year on Saturday 1/9 and Sunday 1/10. We will meet on the first floor of the Canyon area between Dick's and Cantina Laredo, same as last year. Please note that although most stores will not open until 11 am, except for a few anchor stores and coffee shops which may open at 10 am, CNY Folksmarch is being allowed to keep its normal Saturday hours of 8 - 11 am. This means that for inside walkers, we will not run into as many other people in the mall. Our Sunday hours of 1 - 3 pm remain the same. We must



wear masks and maintain social distancing. If you park in one of the large parking lots on Solar Street and enter using the escalator up and across the pedestrian bridge over Hiawatha Blvd., you then need to go down to the first floor. There is an escalator nearby and an elevator a little farther along. There is usually a display of some sort in that area, and there might still be post-Christmas sales going on. Remember to sign up for your Annual Pass or your membership Passport. And if you want the Footnotes mailed to you via the US Post Office, sign up for that, too – or send a check payable to CNY Folksmarch in the amount of \$12.00 to Barbara Crane, 143 Wilson Dr., E. Syracuse, NY 13057.

Walking the perimeter of all 4 floors of the Mall is a full 5k. Or you can walk the perimeter of 1 level of the Mall plus going outside via the pedestrian bridge, along the sidewalk over the bridge on Hiawatha Blvd. and left along the Creek Walk to the Inner Harbor and back. If you choose to walk farther, you could continue on the Creek Walk on sidewalks all the way to the city of Syracuse!

NOTE: COVID19 precautions:

We will practice social distancing and wear masks when necessary and have sanitizer available.

From the **north**, take Interstate 81 South to exit 23B (Destiny USA Dr.)

From the **south**, take Interstate 81 North to exit 23 (Hiawatha Blvd.)

From the **east**, take Interstate 690 West to I-81 North to exit 23 (Hiawatha Blvd.)

From the **west**, take Interstate 690 East to exit 8 (Hiawatha Blvd.)

New York State Thruway: take I-90 to exit 36 (I-81 South) and follow above directions from the north

CNY FOLKSMARCH CELEBRATING 40 -- YES -- 40 YEARS!! IN 2021

It is rare that any organization (especially one like a walking club - a not-for-profit organization, made up of all volunteers that holds a *monthly* event year after year and asks for Leaders and Helpers every single month) could last for 40 years. But Folksmarch will have that distinction in October 2021.



Things have changed some since the early days. Back then it was common to have hundreds of walkers attend each weekend gig. But 40 years ago, Central New Yorkers did not have the variety of events being offered every weekend that we enjoy now. Also, back then and up until 3 years ago, if you belonged to the Y you were automatically a member of Folksmarch. In 2017, Folksmarch became its own entity, and walkers had to choose to be a part of CNY Folksmarch. Currently, there are just over 50 active members, but with a mailing list of over 200. We are hoping the idea of celebrating 40 years will bring some of those former members back to the group as well as impressing some new walkers and having them become members.

2020 has been a challenging year to try and expand membership, but we are hopeful that 2021 will bring in some folks who have been walking anyway - so they may as well join a walking club and be introduced to some new areas and some new people. So, as we kick-off a new year, we are also kicking off our 40th year with a snazzy new t-shirt design that might draw some attention and

pique some interest.


