JULY FOLKSMARCH IN CATO



The Civic Heritage Historical Society will be our sign-in location this month. The center features historical exhibits for the Cayuga County towns of Cato, Ira, Victory and Conquest. Additional parking is available at Mott Park, which is right next to the center on Millard Ave.

Cato is an agricultural town and considered a bedroom community with many folks being employed in Auburn and/or Syracuse. Its scenic hills and picturesque waterways make it an ideal location for outdoor activities like hunting, fishing, boating, hiking, snowmobiling AND a fun location for a Folksmarch!

Some of the village history volunteers will be available on Saturday and Sunday to identify several points of interest Folkmarchers will encounter along the course.


The route will consist mainly of village sidewalks with some rural roadways and some hilly areas. Leashed dogs are allowed, with owners doing any clean-up needed.

Some suggestions for food within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from our sign-in venue: Cato Diner 11256 South St., (closes at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday); NY Pizza, 11376 Main St.; Terry's Food Market (hot and cold deli), 11344 South St.; or just 2.4 miles down the road is Happy Days Drive In, 3022 State Route 370, Meridian.

DIRECTIONS FROM SYRACUSE (2 OPTIONS)

(1) NYS Thruway west to exit 40, Weedsport. Turn left at the exit and drive north on State Route 34 for roughly 8 miles. The Historical Society will be on your right.

(2) Route 690 West to exit for Route 360 West. The village of Cato will be about 12 miles west. At the only intersection in the village (Cato Diner), turn left onto State Route 34. The Historical Society building will be on your left past Terry's Food Mart.

About Us

Folksmarches are generally held on the second weekend every month. The route distance is typically 5K (3.1 miles). Routes vary at each location, but normally include a combination of paved walkways and natural settings. Routes are marked and a map is provided to each walker. A shorter modified route is always available to those who choose not to walk the longer distances. Participants receive a button to commemorate the walk and yearly passport cards are available (for a fee) for participants to record their personal accomplishment after each walk. Purchasing an Annual Membership Pass or a Yearly Passport card is a way to become a member of the CNY Folksmarch walking group.

SERENE FOREST PATHS AT STERLING NATURE CENTER

Two beautiful days provided Folkmarchers an opportunity to enjoy walking quiet forest trails, viewing nesting herons or overlooking Lake Ontario from cliffside observation spots. On Saturday morning Jim from the Nature Center was so kind as to set up a tripod with binoculars so that walkers could get a closer view of the nesting herons. One very interesting path, the Bluff Trail which follows the edge of the cliff above the shoreline, unfortunately was closed due to erosion from wind and water damage. Worth a return visit when the trail is repaired! Some walkers observed the many different birds that live in the various forest and field habitats, as briefly described by the signs posted along the trails. Other FMers explored the spacious new Visitor Center with its many exhibits of local birds and animals.
