November Folksmarch in Chittenango

CNY Folksmarch will be walking in Chittenango on November 8 and 9 at the Chittenango Landing Canal Boat Museum. We have not walked at this site in quite some time and are glad to return to enjoy the trail and museum. The center is located at 717 Lakeport Road, Chittenango, NY 13037, less than a mile north of the village.

Walkers will register at the Canal Landing Visitor Center on Saturday, November 8 between 9 a.m. and Noon; or on Sunday, November 9 between 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. The center holds several nice exhibits about the canal and the center's plan for improvements. The canal path is reached by crossing a pedestrian bridge and is designated as a birding site in our State. The museum buildings and grounds will also be available for exploration.

History: A three-bay dry dock operated along the enlarged Erie Canal on the site at Chittenango Landing from 1855 until 1917. Once the site closed following the completion of the larger barge canal, it quickly fell into disrepair.

In 1985, local enthusiasts rediscovered the abandoned canal site, uncovering remnants of its three-bay dry dock and boatyard. They recreated the 1850s site through archaeology, research, and hard work. This became the Chittenango Landing Canal Boat Museum, an education and recreation park facility. It hosts the only recovered historic dry dock complex on the Erie Canal.

The goal is to inspire life-long interest in innovation and Erie Canal history. The canal museum was greatly affected by the pandemic closing. With new energy, the board of trustees is taking on the challenge of clearing out the dry dock of overgrown vegetation, making repairs to museum buildings, as well as a plan to open a 2,600-foot, four-season building with an outdoor patio that will expand their educational and cultural programs potential.

Directions: The Landing Museum recommends driving east on Route 5 from Syracuse into the Village of Chittenango. When Route 5 makes a sharp turn to the right at a traffic light towards Canastota, YOU should continue straight, through the intersection, onto Lakeport Road. The Canal Landing is .7 miles ahead on your left. If coming from Cicero and northern areas, you could drive East on Route 31, through Bridgeport, and turn right onto Lakeport Road. The Canal Landing will be on your right, just before you get to the Village.



What, Exactly, is CNY Folksmarch

As our regular walkers, and hopefully new walkers know, CNY Folksmarch is a non-competitive walking group. The goal is to encourage people of all ages and abilities to get out and walk by meeting at a variety of locations in Central New York. For 40+ years, we have walked monthly on the second weekend of each month. Walks are usually 5k in length, but participants may walk as far as their abilities and interest allow.

The walks are the visible part of the organization. However, you may not know how we are structured. In 2016, when support by the Greater Syracuse YMCA was no longer available, a handful of long-time participants decided to continue the Folksmarch by forming a not-for-profit organization. Today, CNY Folksmarch is a 501(c)(3) organization that has a board of directors, officers, and bylaws.

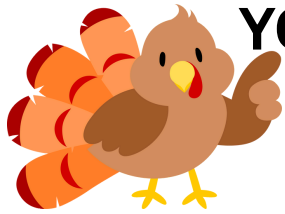
Earlier this year, the CNY Folksmarch Board of Directors decided to initiate a new incentive program in 2025 to recognize walkers who reach several milestones as they walk at our monthly events. Besides the two issues that need member approval, the agenda will include typical meeting items: minutes from the last annual meeting, Treasurer's Report through October 2025, and several items that would benefit from your input. We need your thoughts on monthly walk locations for 2026, volunteering to help at monthly walks, and exploring new ways to expand CNY Folksmarch.

About Us

Folksmarches are generally held on the second weekend every month. The route distance is typically 5K (3.1 miles). Routes vary at each location, but normally include a combination of paved walkways and natural settings. Routes are marked and a map is provided to each walker. A shorter modified route is always available to those who choose not to walk the longer distances. Participants receive a button to commemorate the walk and yearly passport cards are available (for a fee) for participants to record their personal accomplishment after each walk. Purchasing an Annual Membership Pass or a Yearly Passport card is a way to become of member of the CNY Folksmarch walking group.
